

On Sunday October 28, 2007, William Osler Health Centre will be moving approximately 250 inpatients from the existing Peel Memorial Hospital to the new Brampton Civic Hospital. Throughout the day, patients will be transported by ambulance or ambulance bus to their new patient care areas at Brampton Civic Hospital.

Due to the very busy nature of this day, visitors will only be allowed in special circumstances, such as for critically ill or palliative patients. We ask for your assistance and cooperation to make this a success.

How to Get Emergency Care in Brampton on Sunday October 28

On Sunday October 28 at 6:00 am, the Emergency Department at Peel Memorial Hospital will no longer be accepting patients. At the same time, the Emergency Department at Brampton Civic Hospital will open to begin accepting patients. After 6:00 am, if you require emergency treatment or are in labour, please go directly to Brampton Civic Hospital's Emergency Department or call 911 if necessary.

Brampton Civic Hospital Opens Monday October 29

Programs and services currently available at Peel Memorial Hospital are moving to Brampton Civic Hospital. On Monday October 29, Brampton Civic Hospital will be open to the public. If you have an outpatient appointment or procedure scheduled for a date following the move, you will be notified of the location change by hospital personnel. Our Brampton-based Diabetes Education Centre, Asthma Clinic, and Eating Disorders Clinic are also moving from their current off-site locations to Brampton Civic Hospital.

Brampton Civic Hospital will:

- Offer an abundance of natural light throughout with windows in every inpatient room
- Cover over 1.3 million square feet
- Open with 479 beds and transition to 608 beds by 2011/2012
- Ramp up from 12 operating rooms to 18 (in two pods) within three years
- Use the finest technology and sterilization procedures
- Offer a secure, safe and efficient work environment
- Make available retail pharmacy, gift shop, and other retail services (as construction is completed)
- Accommodate 2,570 vehicles (available parking spaces)
- Provide high level security, especially within the maternal newborn unit
- Provide many new and enhanced services

Future of Peel Memorial Hospital

As of Sunday October 28, health care programs and services at Peel Memorial Hospital will be discontinued until redevelopment plans are developed and implemented. The Central West Local Health Integration Network (CWLHN) is leading the consultative and planning process to determine what health care services will be provided at this site.
