## Tribute musician to perform Neil Diamond songs at Legion

If the '70s is your musical era, then this Neil Diamond tribute show is the one for you. Veteran performer Joey Purpura stages his *Diamond in the Rough* at the Georgetown Legion hall, 127 Mill St., on Friday, October 19.

Doors open at 7:15 p.m. with the show at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$15 in advance at the Legion bar (905-877-4413) or \$20 at the door.

"Response is so good that I always get invited back wherever I perform," says Purpura, who has made a career of singing hits such as *Cracklin' Rosie*, *Cherry Cherry*, *Forever in Blue Jeans* and *Sweet Caroline*.

The 33-year-old former Montrealer, who now resides in Mississauga, said he has always had the knack for impersonations but he struck gold "or diamond" with 1970s hitmaker Neil Diamond.

"I wasn't very familiar with Neil Diamond's vast songlist when I started doing the impersonation," said Purpura. "I had no idea how beloved Neil

Diamond is and I had no idea how powerful his music was, and still is, to people."

Included among the list of some of his other impersonations is Elton John, Gordon Lightfoot, James Taylor and Creed.

"Friends have told me that my Elton John is as good or better than Neil Diamond. I may in the next year or so produce an Elton John show as well. But right now I'm enjoying the Neil Diamond act. ... After every performance both the woman and men approach me not only to tell me how much they enjoyed the show, but also to tell me they were teenagers or in their twenties when Neil Diamond emerged, and how I brought them back to that time and place. Or, sometimes, it's the children—who grew up listening to Neil Diamond because their parents were fans of his—that come up to thank me."

\*\*Only small tree stumps under 30 cm (1 ft) in diameter can be accepted at the HWMS.



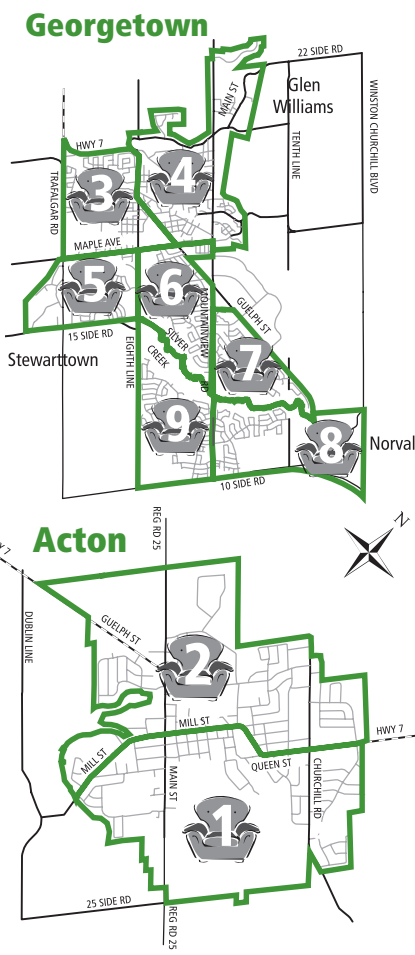
### Metal & Appliance Call-in Collection Service

## Waste Tips Keep Halton Beautiful on Windy Days

You can help reduce litter with some simple steps to prevent your recyclables from taking flight on windy days. Please ensure your Blue Box materials are placed curbside in a secure manner.

- On windy days, place your Blue Boxes out for collection on the morning of collection day, by 7:00 a.m., instead of the night before.
- Secure your recyclables. Stack your Blue Boxes on top of one another to prevent papers from blowing away.
- Fill boxboard boxes with other boxboard material.
- Place heavier items on top of lighter items.
- Flatten and tie large cardboard boxes and place securely underneath or between your recycling boxes.
