Debate an 'insult' to Catholic teens

Dear editor,

On Tuesday, Sept. 18 the Halton Catholic District School Board debated whether to allow public health services access to Catholic elementary schools, to conduct a HPV vaccination program for Grade 8 girls.

This medically and provincially approved program provides these young women with a vaccine developed to prevent cervical cancer and other diseases in females, caused by certain types of genital human papillomavirus (HPV). The vaccine protects against four HPV types, which together cause 70 per cent of cervical cancers and 90 per cent of genital warts.

The debate centered not on the issue of medicine, but on the belief of some of the board members that by providing young Catholic women with this vaccine, they were encouraging promiscuity. This board is not in the position of deciding the medical appropriateness of the vaccine.

Apparently some board members feel that these young women have refrained from pre-marital sex because they were worried about one day developing cervical cancers. I would have thought they were refraining because of the values imparted in their Catholic homes, schools and churches. Certain board members clearly have a low opinion of the young women and the values education they have received.

The research is clear that this vaccine does have an impact on the incidence of HPV. What clearly hasn't been proven is that young women who receive the vaccine are more promiscuous. This board's debate, and the opinions of some of its members, clearly are an insult to young Catholic women and their families. Fortunately in the end, the board narrowly voted to allow the vaccination program to proceed.


