

Man charged after two women assaulted

She said the suspect ran off and attempted to jump a nearby fence.

The victim's husband, who also did not want to be identified, said he and the other man approached the suspect who "denied he did anything."

The men didn't restrain him because they thought it would be wiser to wait for police officers to arrive.

The suspect then walked away.

Police arrived shortly afterward

and began checking the area.

Meanwhile a couple who had been walking in the area saw a suspicious man following a woman along Argyll Road in the Hamilton Cres. area about 7:50 p.m.

The couple followed the man because they were worried about the woman's safety. The woman eluded the man by darting across Argyll and then the man turned and started towards the couple who then fled.

Shortly after, the pair flagged down a police cruiser and indicated to officers where the suspect was

last seen.

Police then arrested a man.

Charged with sexual assault, assault, and two counts of wear a disguise while committing an indictable offence is Jason Andrew Jack, 26, of Hamilton Cr.

He was released on bail in Milton Court Monday and is to appear in court again Nov. 23.

Tax reserve funds to be used to cover zoning fee for fire station

Dollars from the Tax Rate Stabilization Reserve will be used to pay the zoning amendment fee for the new fire station headquarters in Georgetown South.

Council recently waived the fire department project's requirement to pay the \$6,000 planning department fee. Instead, the planning department will be credited with \$6,000 from the reserve fund. No one attended a recent public meeting concerning the zoning amendment that is required before the new headquarters building can be constructed on the northwest corner of 10 Sideroad and Eighth Line.

A reconstructed building at the current Maple Ave. fire station will house a smaller fire hall and a regional ambulance station.
