Players toss rubber pucks at the board. The goal is to get the pucks through the holes, but players also score by landing on the board (the pucks stick).

Stamp invented the game 10 years ago as something to keep the wives and kids of horseshoe players entertained while they were watching tournaments. Since then he's sold about 100 of the games for \$100 each.

Stamp, a pipeline welder who does some general maintenance work at the CBC, auditioned for the show after he was encouraged by maintenance employees there.

While he didn't get anyone to invest in his game, he is still in the running for a \$50,000 prize. The winner of that money is chosen by audience members who cast votes for their favourite entrepreneur.

Stamp said while he was hoping to get "the exposure the other people did" he plans to try out for the show again next year.

"I have inventions coming out of my ears," said Stamp.
