Council of the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting on **Monday, November 12, 2007** to discuss and seek public input into the proposed amendments to the Business Licensing By-law as a result of the 2007 review of By-law No. 2005-0067 by the Business Licensing Review Committee.

Significant proposed amendments include a reclassification of businesses within the retail class of businesses, changes to the taxicab sector, as well as, a number of housekeeping amendments throughout the by-law. Changes to the General Provisions of the By-law are a result of recent amendments to the Municipal Act, 2001. The Committee is also making recommendations to amend the fee structure for retail and taxicab tariffs in the 2008 Municipal Rates and Services Charges By-law.

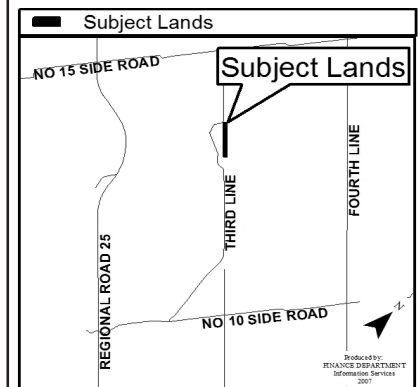
### SALE OF LAND

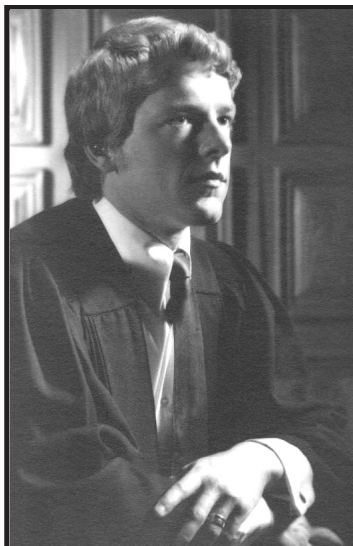
