Well, the Santa Claus Parade finishes its run on Mill Street, right in front of the Legion building, at 127 Mill Street.

The Legion dinner organizers were concerned that the parade would distract from their dinner, especially when those veterans attending were standing, silently observing the Last Post and two minutes of silence, in honour of their fallen comrades—just as a passing band was striking up another chord of *Here Comes Santa Claus* to the delight of all those people lining the streets.

For some reason, veterans really don't wish to hear happy celebratory music when they're remembering fathers, brothers, uncles and husbands who died for the freedom we enjoy—oh yeah, including freedom to assemble in a parade.
