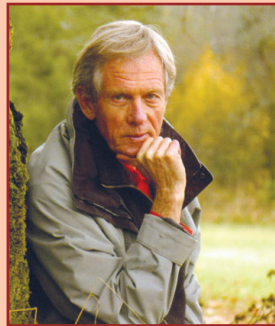

Globe Productions launches Singin' in the Rain tomorrow

You remember the plot. You love the characters. You know "the song." It's no less than the stage adaptation of one of the most celebrated and beloved films of all time.

Georgetown Globe Musical Productions brings the classic Broadway musical *Singin' in the Rain*, based on the 1952 MGM film, to the John Elliott Theatre for seven performances only beginning Thursday (tomorrow).

The show features such unforgettable songs as *Make 'em Laugh*, *Good Morning* and the show stopping *Singin' in the Rain* complete with real rain onstage.

1920s Hollywood is the setting for this zany, light-hearted romantic comedy about the early days of sound film, when many a movie studio found itself scrambling to salvage the career of its chipmunk-voiced silent picture star.

When asked how it will rain on stage, director Alexander Galant simply smiles and replies, "with water!"

Galant is not only an award-winning theatre director but an award-winning filmmaker who's bringing his talents to recreate the old film world of early Hollywood. There are swashbuckling films and comedic tributes to the silent film era, making the show a technically spectacular multimedia production.

Deb Tilson, is no stranger to Georgetown audiences, having been on stage as a performer and also in the pit as musical director, the position which she holds for this show. Tilson teaches voice, piano and theory at her home in



Rockwood.

Rounding out the artistic team is Angel Ottema, the Guelph-based choreographer, who's been keeping the cast literally on their toes as she choreographs some of the shows toe-tappin' numbers. The *Singin' in the Rain* finale will leave you singin' and dancin' long after you've left the theatre.

Hilarious situations, snappy dialogue, and a hit-parade score of Hollywood standards make *Singin' In The Rain* the perfect entertainment for any fan of the golden age of movie musicals.

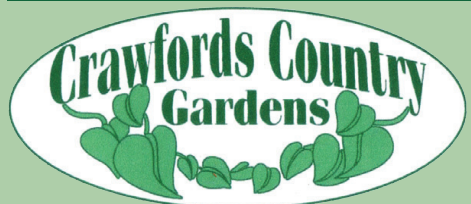

Avoid toys with sharp edges and points or small parts. Also avoid toys that fly, shoot projectiles or produce loud noises.

Look for toys that are durable, well-constructed and easy to clean.

When choosing a fabric toy, make sure it is labeled flame-retardant or nonflammable.

Check stuffed toys for secure stitching of eyes and other small parts.

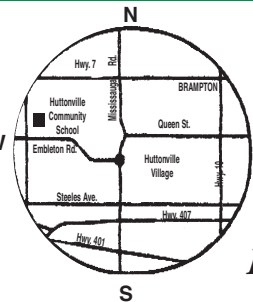
