Pellet gun seized from student at school

Halton Police responded to Georgetown District High School at 11:30 a.m. yesterday (Thursday) after receiving a report that a bus parked at the school had been struck with a pellet, causing a small dent, and a male youth was seen entering the school with what was believed to be a pellet gun.

Four officers went to the school and shortly afterward located a male with a pellet-type gun.

A police spokesperson said the youth was not displaying the gun, was not threatening anyone with it, and that there was no risk to the student population.

Police took the youth into custody briefly at the school, but decided not to charge him and the matter was resolved with the school administration and parents of the youth.
