
More Blue and Green for a Better Planet Household Hazardous Waste



Residential household hazardous waste can injure waste collectors, and can damage the environment if disposed of improperly. Household hazardous waste must not be put in the garbage or poured down the drain.

Instead, residential hazardous waste can be taken to the **Household Hazardous Waste Depot** located at the Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS), 5400 Regional Road 25, Milton. The HWMS is open Monday to Saturday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Each year the Household Hazardous Waste Depot recycles or properly disposes over 800,000 litres of residential hazardous waste!



Accepted free of charge:



- Aerosol cans (full)
- Antifreeze
- Automobile and household batteries
- Fluorescent bulbs and tubes (8 maximum)
- Fuels
- Garden chemicals
- Household batteries
- Household cleaners
- Motor oil and filters
- Paints and stains
- Pesticides
- Pharmaceuticals (over-the-counter and prescription)
- Propane tanks
- Solvents
- Varsol (clean or used)

There is a 20 litre maximum per visit. All containers must be left at the Depot.

Not Accepted:



- Commercial Hazardous Waste
- Radioactive Waste
- Explosives (for example: dynamite, ammunition, nitro glycerine)
- Biological Wastes and PCBs

Empty paint cans (dry with lids removed) and other empty containers (with no liquid or powder residue) can be disposed of with regular garbage.

Paint Reuse Shed

Looking for paint to repaint your home? Pick up usable paint and stain at the Reuse Shed for free. The Paint Reuse Shed is conveniently located beside the Household Hazardous Waste Depot. Open from spring to fall. The HWMS cannot guarantee which colours will be available.
