Full house takes in event at JET

Gloves come off at all-candidates meeting

this event unlike the previous night when only two of the five attended a Norval Community Association debate.

The candidates are MP Michael Chong (Conservative), who is seeking re-election; Brent Bouteiller (Green), Bruce Bowser (Liberal), Noel Duignan (New Democratic Party) and Jeffery Streutker (Christian Heritage Party).

The audience seemed to be stacked with mainly Liberal and Conservative-leaning supporters—either applauding or vocally-challenging the candidates—but some Bouteiller

and Duignan comments were well received too. Gasps, groans and heckling followed the majority of Streutker's comments.

Questions varied from climate change/environment, economy, poverty, Harper politics, gas tax, early childcare program, Conservative cuts to Status of Women Canada, and ideological approaches to decision-making.

While the economy and environment got the most attention during the night, it was the question on "Prime Minister Stephen Harper's right-wing approach" which led to a descent
