Records tumble for Truscott and relay teammates

Georgetown's Tasha Truscott has broken her share of individual Canadian and provincial swimming records and she's now making it a team effort.

The 14-year-old was a member of the Etobicoke Swim Club relay foursome that recently bettered five national age group times, six Ontario records and seven benchmarks previously set by her home club, which hosted the 2008 Hall of Fame meet at the Etobicoke Olympium.

Truscott, along with teammates Lauren Earp, Jacqueline Keire and Brittany MacLean, are national age group record holders in the relay for the 200m and 400m freestyle events in both the short and long course distances, as well as the long course 200m medley race.

A Grade 10 student at Silverthorn Collegiate in Etobicoke, Truscott also owns the Canadian record for the 13-14 age group in the 100m long course butterfly.
