Pursuant to the *Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2001* and the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005* this Committee provides advice on the preparation, implementation and effectiveness of an annual accessibility plan that addresses the identification, removal and prevention of barriers to people with disabilities.
