Children love to build forts and tunnels in the snow, and need lots of the white stuff to do this. The banks and hills of snow along the roadway attract children as a play area, but they can also pose a dangerous threat to a child. Passing snowplows and the debris and ice they push can spell disaster for a child, often unseen by the plow operator. The plow or wing can strike the child indirectly or directly.

Other cases: a child tunneling into the snow bank may be buried.
