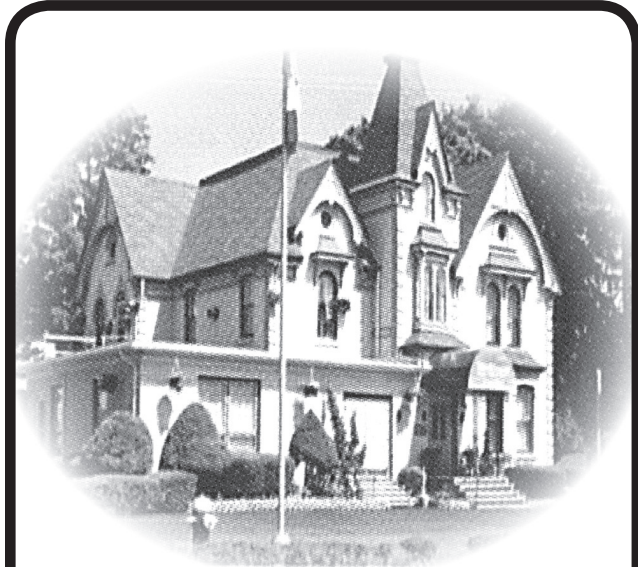

can't do all of the projects that need to be done.

"It seems to me that you are continuing to dig a further hole for yourselves from an infrastructure standpoint," McLean said, asking what is the use of development, just for the sake of development.

Rachlin Drive resident Glen Rollins said he shares all of the concerns raised by his neighbours, who are circulating a petition against the development, adding he's also concerned for his children's safety with the potential of increased traffic on Churchill Road.

Although there have been no objections filed by the various agencies that the plans were circulated to, Halton planners said the application is premature because there is no water allocation for it, and further studies are required because of the proximity to the sewage treatment plant and closed Acton dump.

Town planning director Bruce MacLean said that all of the concerns raised at the meeting would be addressed in a staff report that would be brought back to Council for debate.

He noted that the lands are within Acton's urban boundary and are designated for low-density housing.

The public has until February 24 to comment on the application.
