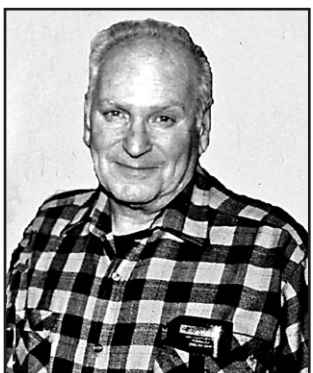


DEATHS

 potters, painters and artists from other disciplines will be at work. There are a record number of participants at the mall this year, as the festival continues to build in popularity. Another rare treat for the public is a tour of the Artcast plant. This company has been producing famous bronze statues for cities and projects around the world since 1964 (see artcast.com). "Our town is definitely an arts destination," says Arts Week member Lois Fraser. "The visual artists, musicians, actors and dancers here rival those of any major city. To think that we have all this in a town of 50,000 is amazing!"

Smoking ban coming

When the more stringent Smoke-Free Ontario Act becomes law on May 31, making all workplaces and enclosed public spaces 100 per cent smoke-free, the Town will repeal its smoking legislation. At a recent Town Council meeting, Rob Ustrzycki, the Town's manager of bylaw enforcement, said the provincial legislation is more restrictive than the Town's for restaurants and bar patios. "For example, the simple fact that it has a roof, partial or complete, is the only essential element that's required where smoking under those circumstances is prohibited, so essentially it can be a gazebo that has a roof, that has no sides to it - but under the provincial legislation (smoking) would be prohibited," he said, adding under the Town's bylaw, smoking would be allowed. Ustrzycki said after May 31, local health officials would carry out inspections, investigate complaints of non-compliance and enforce the new Smoke Free Ontario Act.
