Maureen Smith is a longtime member of the Toronto section of the Bruce Trail Association, and lives in Georgetown. She gave an excellent slide show and informative talk on the Bruce Trail at the Acton Seniors Centre recently. Smith gave some background of the Trail. When four members of the Hamilton Naturalist Club had a meeting in September 1960, Ray Lowes asked Robert Bateman "What would you think of a trail winding along the escarpment from one end to the other?" This thought initiated the whole project.


There were four members at the first Bruce Trail Association committee meeting. Ray Lowes, Robert Bateman, Norman Pearson, and Dr Robert MacLaren. Ray's dream became true due to his hard work, and the dedication of many including Phil Gosling who took a year off work to persuade land owners to allow the club to build and maintain a trail the 850 km. length of the Escarpment (there are also 300km. of side trails).

The Trail is well marked with white blazes painted on trees, rocks and posts. Where there is a scenic view point or a secondary trail it is marked in blue.

The Trail association has over 8,000 members at present. You do not have to be a member to use the trail, but they do ask you to respect people's property and stick to the trail.

Maureen and Heinz often conduct hikes which they advertise, and newcomers are welcome to join the group. They usually meet at Zeller's car park in Georgetown and car pool to the designated spot.


