Kicks in May 1st in Halton Hills

Electricity bills will jump by 11 per cent on May 1 that's \$11.92 cents more per month or \$143.04 annually – for the Acton homeowner who uses an average of 1,000 kilowatt hours a month under new rates released last week by the Ontario Energy

Consumers now pay artificially low prices for electricity at five cents a kilowatt hour for the first 1,000 kilowatts used during the winter, and 5.8 cents for anything above that.

The rate increases – blamed on last summer's sweltering heat that sent energy costs soaring - are 5.8 cents for the first 600 kilowatts used between May and October, and then 6.7 cents.

The 11 per cent increase for Halton Hills Hydro's 18,500 residential customers includes a 2.3 per cent increase in the distribution rate - \$2.49 a month for an average use of 1,000 kilowatts – and 8.7 per cent more, or \$9.42 in the regulated price.

"The government has always said we need to get to the true cost of power and this (the new rates) is a start to doing that," said
