## Green light for new Fair Bd. building

## CORP.F. MASTER: Council approves PTE.J.J.KENNEI \$1.3 million loan

Subject to a number of conditions, the Town will loan the Acton Agricultural Society \$1.3-million to help it construct a new multi-purpose building in Prospect Park

Town councillors okayed the loan, in principle, under the Town's Municipal Assistance Program on Tuesday, ending the Society's sevenyear bid to replace the old Acton arena that was torn down by the Town after it built a new arena in Acton East.

Council's approval hinges on the Society securing the balance of \$350,000 for a \$500,000 down payment, getting an updated construction cost estimate from a surveyor and providing rental contracts from building users guaranteeing revenue.

That isn't going to be a problem according to Drew Brown, the professional fundraiser hired by the Society to spearhead its ambitious \$750,000 fundraising campaign, co-chaired by former councillor Norm Elliott, Halton CAO and Acton resident

Brent Marshall and Society building committee chair Jim Pink.

Asked if he had any concerns with the Town's conditions Brown said that he was "quite confident" the Society could raise the money in "reasonably short order."

The Society already has \$250,000 in its building fund and its goal is significantly more than what is required for the financing plan.

Brown also said the Trillium Foundation was waiting to learn of Town Council's decision on the loan before it dealt with the Society's request for a \$100,000 grant to pay for the indoor turf.

The Society's plans call for a \$1.9-million, 25,600-square-foot building on the footprint of the old arena, and while the main purpose
