the EWAG Family Health Team is delighted with the community response to its recent telephone survey.

During February and March 2006, some 375 residents of East Wellington agreed to be part of a phone survey about their use of health services over the past two years.

The Task Group is now using the results of the survey as it identifies the specific primary health care services most needed locally. Next, they will have to develop a business case, which will be submitted to the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care over the summer. Ministry staff have recently been out to Erin for the purpose of briefing interested doctors.

'We are indeed grateful to have received so many thoughtful responses," said Derek Bloomfield, President of EWAG. "This input will help us design the best possible team for the community.

Following Ministry approval of the overall plan, there will be additional steps needed before the Family Health Team becomes operational and sees its first patient.
