



UNESCO goes as far as saying that quality physical education is a basic right of every child.

Over the last decade or more, there has been a significant decline in the quality and quantity of school physical education being offered to children. Most schools in Canada are not providing the recommended national standard of 150 minutes per week of physical education, or even
