"It's not fair to her to keep her from her home," Kimberly Bouclair said, reiterating that they didn't mean to cause Arnott any harm and they thought she would be safe in the vehicle.

Asked about Arnott's location on Monday, Halton

Acting Inspector Joe Baker said he believed she had been transferred to a "long-term care facility somewhere within our borders."

Baker said once the courts deal with the issue, Arnott would be able to say where she wants to live.

"As I understand it, she doesn't fear them (her next

of kin) so she's going to want contact with them again, so I don't think that they will make it unreasonably harsh on her by moving her some great distance away from the community that she's grown to know," Barker said.

The Bouclairs appear in court on August 25.

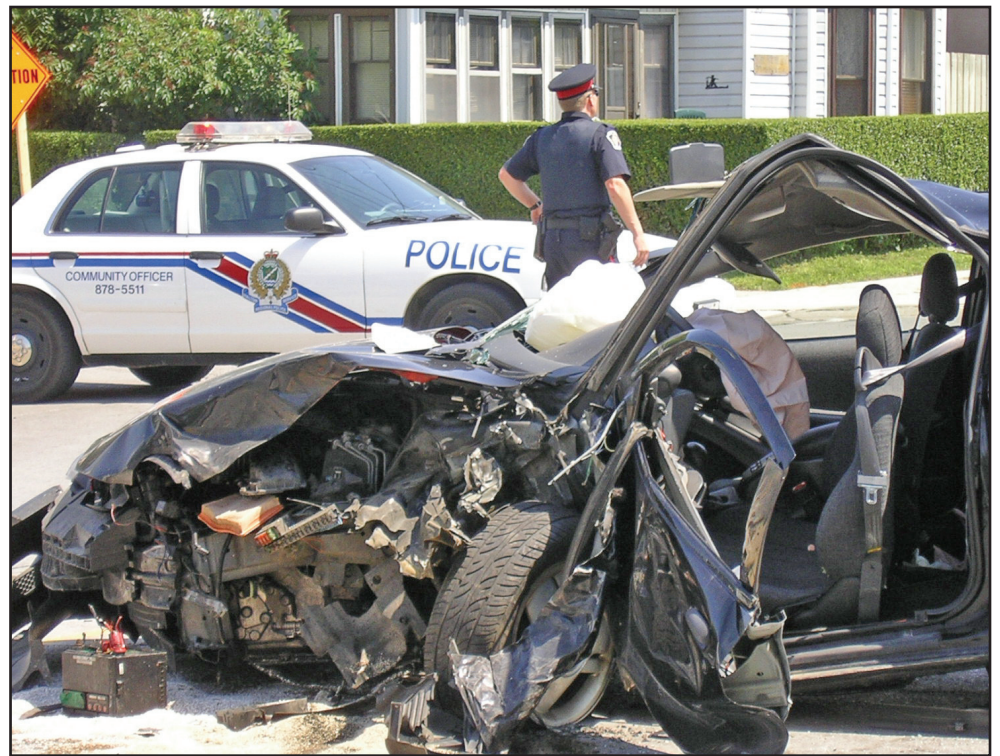

## Woman survives horrific collision on Main Street

At first, Floyd Foster thought he heard a baby crying in the mangled wreckage of a car crushed under the wheels of a transport truck in front of his Main Street North garage just after 2 on Monday afternoon. Drawn to the carnage by a loud bang, it was the whimpering that stopped Foster cold when he ran to the scene.

"I heard some noise - I thought it was a baby actually, but then I realized it was a dog. We ripped the door off and grabbed the dog and one guy ran with it to the vet, but he died - a little pup, a beautiful little white pup," Foster said, still shaken by the incident the next day.

"I checked her (the woman driver.) She had a pulse

and I talked to her. They first thing she said was "how is my little doggie?" and I told her it was okay," Foster said, speculating the dog may have played a role in the crash because it's leash was laying across the woman's lap and she didn't have her seatbelt on.

Foster's son Norm called 911 and began talking to the injured woman until emergency officials arrived to transport her to hospital. The truck driver was shaken and, but not injured enough to require hospitalization.

"The truck driver said he thought the truck was going to roll over it bounced so high when it went over the car. It took the whole front end off the car and ripped it right apart...both airbags were out and the roof was ripped right out

- you just can't imagine," Foster said.

Foster said after the ambulance left, his son began to sweep up the glass and debris from the street in hopes that traffic, backed up in both directions as far as you could see, would begin moving again, but police kept the road closed for much longer than Foster thought was necessary.

Halton police said the driver of the car, a 22-year-old woman who had just moved back to Acton, was treated and released from Milton hospital.

She had just left the vet's and was southbound on Main Street, attempting to turn left onto St. Alban's Drive, when the accident occurred.

Police said charges are pending against her under the Highway Traffic Act.
