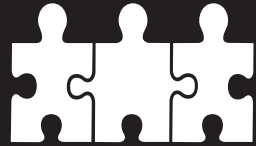
tree, and then winter Santa rode his motorized sleigh into the games room.

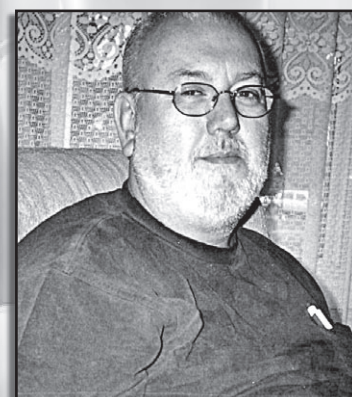
Dr. Trudy McNabb gave a special touch to the celebration when she wore her mother's wedding dress which was also her great grandmother's, making it almost 150 years old.
