member, said the project would be a "corner stone" for the community as he thanked the councillors, committee members, donors and families of the 3 Musketeers, three Acton boys who died in a car/train crash almost five years ago south of Acton.

The Toth, Dick and Everson families pledged \$30,000 to the skateboard park from proceeds of their annual golf tournament, and handed over the final cheque for \$10,000 at the groundbreaking ceremony.

Bonnette said the family's sponsorship of the skatepark is a legacy the families can leave for the boys that will benefit all youth. He also praised the fundraising committee that raised more than \$100,000, sentiments echoed by Fendley who also thanked the 3 Musketeers' families for "sharing your boys with us. Their memories will live on."

Finding a suitable location delayed the project, but Terry Alymann, the Town's director of recreation and parks, said it was worth

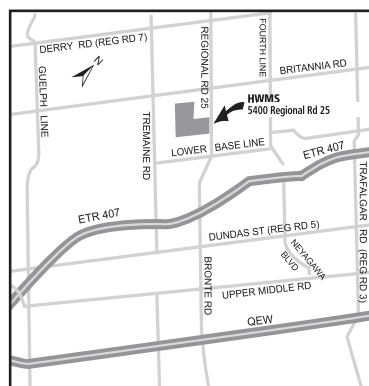
