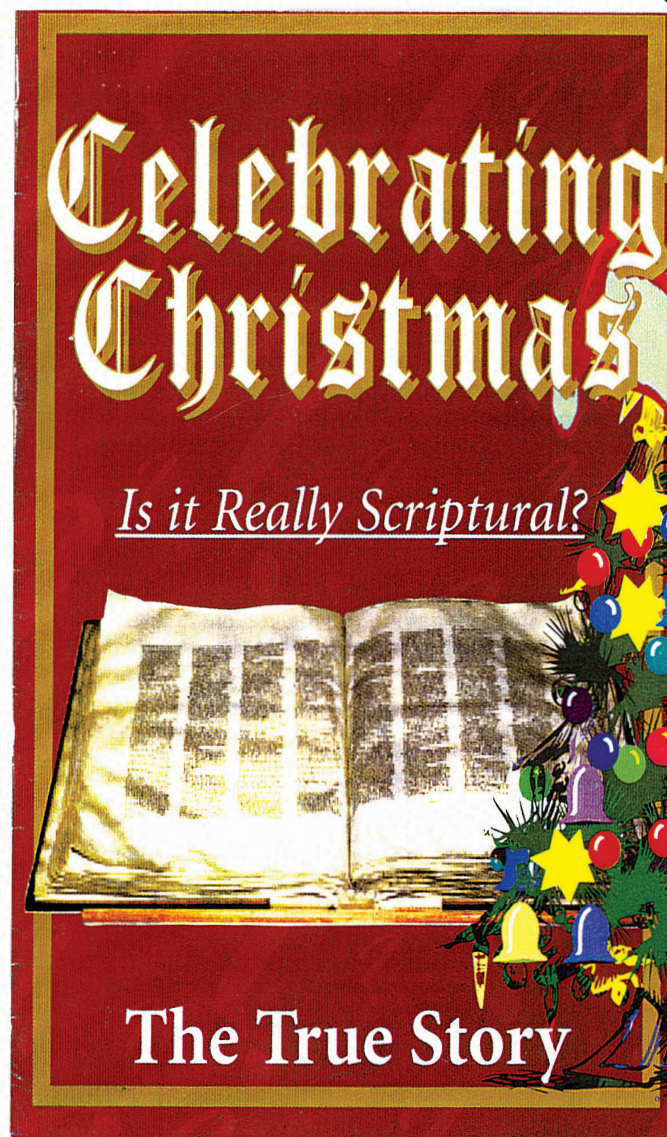

lic that the advance polls, like the one at the mall, are open for everyone to vote early, possible with better and clearer signage.

"It says Vote Here, but maybe even if it said You Can Vote Here or Vote Today if You Can – some way to convey to people – there were an awful lot of people in that mall that didn't vote who had the opportunity," Fogal said.

Acton Councillor Mike O'Leary echoed Fogal's comments about reaching more potential voters, and recounted how he voted at an advance poll at the Acton arena.

"There was about, I'd say, a good 75 adults in the lobby

of the arena watching a Zamboni go round and round and there was no one in the voting (area)."

Retiring Councillor Ron Chatten questioned if mail-in or on-line voting in Markham helped increase the voter turnout and Regional Ward 1/2 Councillor Clark Somerville said that neighbouring Guelph-Eramosa Township had "huge" issues with spoiled and rejected ballots.

"As we're doing the strategic planning and debriefing, (we should) start to look at other ways we can do it and do it better..." Somerville said.

Mayor Rick Bonnette noted that 19 per cent of the mail-in votes in Fergus were rejected, but agreed the process was something to look at.
