ommunity Advent service Sunday

As the Christmas season becomes more secular with increasing promotion from advertisers urging people to buy more and more, along comes the season of Advent which Acton churches will mark this Sunday evening at Trinity United Church. The service is being sponsored by the Acton Ministerial Association with the theme

"The Twelve Gifts of Christmas.

Advent begins on the Sunday nearest November

30 and covers four Sundays before Christmas. The word advent comes from the Latin and means "The coming," referring to the coming of Jesus at Christmas.

For centuries, probably since the fourth century, Advent has been a time of spiritual reflection as well as anticipation. Originally it was a time when converts to Christianity readied themselves for baptism. Later, during the Middle Ages, Advent became associated with the Second Coming of Christ. Latterly although a time of prayer and fasting, most of the focus is on the Nativity of Christmas Day.

One of the customs still observed is the lighting of an Advent wreath with four candles, three of purple and one rose coloured. Purple signifies royalty, the candle represents hope, peace and love, These candles are lit on the first, second and fourth Sundays of Advent, The rose coloured candle, symbolizing joy is lit on the third Sunday.

Sometimes a fifth white candle is placed in the wreath and lit on Christmas day.

Many homes also have their own Advent wreath and calendars to count the days until Christmas Day.
