The program allows participants to get accreditation in English and Math, which will go towards a high school equivalency credit, accepted at Sheridan College for both academic programming and apprenticeships. Participants can attend on a part time basis, two nights per week, in each subject.

Those with a goal of attending Sheridan College Academic programs or who wish to achieve required math skills to go towards apprenticeship eligibility, will be able to access this

adults who wish to upgrade and attend academic programming at Sheridan, but who do not have the necessary skills to attend ACE programming at this time. LNH continues to support those who wish to improve their skills in order to help their children, get or keep a job, or increase their sense of independence.
