December temperatures 4.7 degrees above normal here

December is typically the start of the winter season with cold temperatures and snow, but this year record breaking temperatures for the month were recorded throughout Ontario.

In many areas of the province it was the warmest December on record. In places where temperatures were not the warmest, they were the second warmest. It was so warm only a few communities in Northern and Northwestern Ontario had a white Christmas.

Temperatures in this area were 4.7 degrees warmer than normal for the month.

Ski and snowmobile areas didn't have a great start to the season. Even though precipitation in December

was within normal values, warmer temperatures meant that all the precipitation that fell was rain. Winter sports enthusiasts weren't
