#### <u>Public forum</u>

### Is incineration best way to deal with Halton's waste?

Halton Region is planning to spend \$800 million to build an incinerator. Is it a wise use of tax money? Are incinerators the best way to deal with waste? What are the benefits of incineration? What are the drawbacks? What are the options?

That's the topic of a forum in Oakville on Tuesday, March 27 when Dr. Paul Connett, Professor Emeritus of Chemistry from St. Laurence University in Canton, N.Y., will speak. Dr. Connett specializes in environmental chemistry and toxicology, and has co-authored six peer reviewed articles on dioxin and numerous on waste management.

"He is the only person I know who can make waste interesting," well known activist Ralph Nader says of Dr. Connett who will be

joined by Rod Muir, a waste diversion campaignor from the Sierra Club of Canada, and John Jackson, program director for Great Lakes United.

"It's a timely forum as the Region is currently preparing a business case for the incinerator and it is scheduled to be finished sometime this month," says Barbara Halsall of Protect Our Water and Environmental Resources (POWER) which is co-sponsoring the forum with Oakville green Conservation Association. The proposed incinerator is to be built at the Region's landfill on Bronte Rd.
