GreenCart Open Houses

Why: Halton Region is seeking feedback from you on implementing the GreenCart program Region-wide. Approximately 45% of the average garbage bag in Halton is made up of food scraps and other organic material that could be turned into compost. The proposed Region-wide implementation of the GreenCart program is an initiative to help achieve the 60% waste diversion goal outlined in Halton's 2006-2010 Solid Waste Management Strategy. This 60% diversion goal will assist in extending the life of our landfill.

When: Four Open Houses are being held to gather feedback on the proposed Region-wide implementation of the GreenCart program.

What: The GreenCart is like a Blue Box that is used for your kitchen scraps (including fruits and vegetables, meat, bones, dairy, rice and breads), paper towels, coffee grounds and more. These materials can be collected at the curb in the GreenCart, instead of in a regular garbage bag.
