What do you do – if anything – to help conserve electricity? Is energy conservation part of your life?



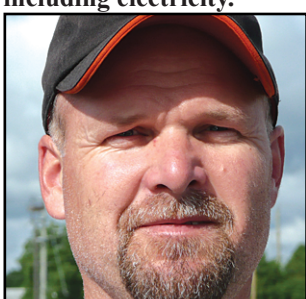
Ron Jeffrey, Acton

Tractor Olympics

Country Heritage Park is presenting the All Colour Antique Tractor and Toy Show, featuring the first ever Tractor Olympics demonstration tomorrow (Friday) and on Saturday and Sunday.

This is the first time Country Heritage Park is staging the Tractor Olympics, featuring three events including: lawn tractors, drivers under 16 years of age; lawn tractors, drivers over 16 years of age; and antique farm tractors under 3000 pounds.
