Bike driver, Cadillac crash Sunday

Halton police believe a Milton motorcycle rider was speeding when he slammed into a Cadillac at 10:42 Sunday morning in the intersection of Guelph Line and 10 Side Road in Nassagaweya.

A police press release said the driver of a bike who was southbound on Guelph Line, "may have been travelling at an apparent high rate of speed just prior to the impact" with a car that was turning west on 10 Side Road from Guelph Line.

The 19-year-old was thrown from his bike and taken to Milton District Hospital, then transferred by air ambulance to Hamilton General Hospital. At press time is was in stable condition with non-life threatening injuries.

The Cadillac driver, an 84-year-old Milton resident, was treated at the scene for minor injuries and released.

Officers are reconstructing the accident and ask witnesses to call Detective Constable Steve Martin at 905-878-5511 ext. 2379.

Halton get Triple A rate

Standard and Poor's Ratings Services published its annual review of Halton Region's credit standing in May of 2007 and affirmed its highest rating of AAA. In addition, S&P attached a stable outlook to the rating.

S&P is the second independent agency to review Halton's credit rating this year. In April, Moody's Investors Service announced it would continue to rate Halton as AAA.

Standard and Poor's rating analysis included the following rationale in support of its AAA rating determination:

•Halton's strong net creditor status. While the region plans to increase its debt outstanding in the coming years to fund capital expenditures, its exceptionally strong liquidity is such that even after planned debt issuance the region is expected to remain a strong net creditor.

•Halton's very strong and consistent budgetary performance. Financial flexibility is provided by Halton's operating results, a key credit strength.

•Halton's solid economic fundamentals and performance. S&P anticipates that Halton's economic prospects will remain strong in regard to population and assessment growth.


The construction is expected to start on July 26, 2007, with completion expected by early November 2007.
