Ministry investigates quarry mishap

The Ministry of Labour is investigating an industrial accident at Dufferin Aggregate's Acton quarry that injured a dump truck on Friday morning.

Halton police said the 38year-old driver from Caledon was attempting to pull a tarp over his load when he lost his footing and fell four feet from the truck, injuring his back when he hit the ground.

He was taken to hospital, treated and released.

in the community or through other government agencies, or could ask the budget committee to consider including money for a purchase of service agreement to maintain the service in North Halton in the 2008 budget. That's the option picked by the committee and then endorsed by Regional Council in July.

Acton Councillor Clark Somerville, vice-chair of Halton's Health and Social Services committee, said because the issue was forwarded to the budget committee, there was little debate about harm reduction, which is drug policy and programming that tries to reduce harms associated with substance abuse without requiring abstinence.

Harm reduction has been shown to work in other areas, but I said we needed statistics to show if the program is really a viable thing that we should be spending money on," Somerville said on Monday, adding that information will be available during December's budget

Regional staff said POSSE Project offers a valuable service to vulnerable youth in North Halton, and is unique to the north because Oakville and Burlington don't have

services.

Needle notes

The number of new needles distributed by Halton for intravenous drug use was down last year and the number of needles used to inject steroids increased.

The latest report on Halton's needle exchange program showed needles were provided to clients on 462 occasions last year, and staff provided advice, information and counselling on 173 occasions, bringing the total number of client contacts to 635, down from 672 the previous year.

In Acton, staff had a total of eight contacts, including three who exchanged needles used for intramuscular injection of steroids, and five who exchanged needles used for intravenous injection of illicit drugs.

POSSE Project began in 2004 as a one-year Hepatitis C prevention project funded by Health Canada, and it grew to include harm reduction, peer outreach and human rights programs that cost approximately \$120,000 annually to run in Acton, Georgetown and Milton. To expand Region-wide would require a budget of \$360,000

a year. Somerville said whoever ends up offering the harm reduction program, he wants assurances that accurate information and messages will be offered.

"I've never had a problem with needle exchanges or harm reduction programs because if you prevent one case of AIDS or HIV you can literally save the public health system millions of dollars," he said, adding he would have difficulty with safe injection sites.
