Society fundraising committee members are checking their lists one last time to ensure they get the names and figures correct for a donor recognition wall that will be unveiled during a private reception at the new facility on September 7.

While they haven't hit the \$750,000 goal – donations sit at \$605,000 – building committee member George Henderson is confident "we can reach that goal" even though their contract with a professional fundraiser is over.

"We felt we had to get this first donor recognition completed before the fair...we're still out canvassing on a smaller scale now," Henderson said on Sunday

-led by Dufferin Aggregate's \$200,000 that earned them naming rights for the facility that is officially known as the Dufferin Rural Community Centre. The main tenant is the Acton and Georgetown Soccer clubs.

There are 11 levels of giving to the building fund for the \$1.9-million facility, and Henderson said everyone will be thanked, including the 77 individuals who won prize money from entries in fair competitions and turned it back to the building fund. That list will be updated annually.

"We've got a Benefactor category for \$1,000, a Patron category for \$250 and a Community Supporter for \$50 - there are a lot of ways to give and we appreciate every

donation," he said, noting they have four Outstanding Community Builders, each that donated at least \$100,000.

ODD/EVEN WATER RESTRICTIONS IN PLACE

Halton Region has implemented a mandatory odd/even water restriction on outdoor water use. Odd-numbered municipal (or street) addresses can water on odd numbered calendar days and even-numbered municipal addresses can water on even numbered calendar days. Watering is permitted only between the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

This restriction includes the watering of lawns, flower/vegetable gardens, trees and shrubs. Vehicle washing is also included in the odd/even restrictions.
