Halton fights homelessness

Halton Regional Council approved \$3.1 million on July 11 for an Expression of Interest and proposal call to prevent and address homelessness in Halton. The funds are from the Region, the Province and the Federal government's Homelessness Partnering Strategy.

The funds made available for the Expression of Interest represents a major step in achieving the shortterm priorities regarding homelessness in Halton's Comprehensive Housing Strategy. The Strategy incorporates a series of policies and actions to ensure a variety of affordable housing types for Halton residents, regardless of income and stage of life.

The priorities being addressed will help people retain their housing, assist homeless individuals and families with temporary housing and supports to help them regain permanent housing, and support projects for homeless youth and families in all Haltonmunicipalities.

The Request for Expression of Interest will be issued during this month and will close in September, 2007.
