Deer pose a serious safety risk for drivers and it is important for drivers to be aware of a potential collision and take proper precautions including:

Wearing your seatbelt * Staying awake, alert and sober

* Driving with extra cau-tion when driving through deer-crossing zones

* When driving at night, use high beams when there is no oncoming traffic to better illuminate deer on, or near the road

* Taking extra caution from sunset to midnight, and the hours shortly before and after sunrise, as these are the most high-risk times for deervehicle collisions

* If faced with a deer in your path, brake firmly, but stay in your lane. Many deerrelated collisions occur when drivers swerve into traffic to avoid a deer.

In the event that your vehicle strikes a deer, call the County of Wellington OPP immediately.
