air force flags."
I informed him that the army, navy and air force were insignias, not flags, and I would be willing to get all the available information I could lav my hands on to help them and that I did not think it appropriate to fly those particular items at the Cenotaph.

The answer I got was that it was their Cenotaph and they could fly what they wanted. Councillor Scott seemed to agree and said he would look into it himself.

I did not give up. I served in the Royal Canadian Navy and have been a member of the Royal Canadian Legion for a lot of years. I may be old but I am not about to stand by and let our Cenotaph be used as anything but

for what it was intended.

The standard that we need to know to make those kinds of decisions are laid down by Canadian Heritage. That is where the Legion gets their information.

Anyone can get the information off the website which is on is on page 12 of July/August Legion Magazine. (13 pages).

You can also get the info on the Royal Union Flag. Which was disrespectfully called "The Jack."

That flag is not only the Royal Union Flag but is also the flag of a sovereign country, namely Great Britain and you don't fly another country's flag on a Canadian Cenotaph.

The Canadian flag and the Cenotaph should not be subject to indignities by anyone and that includes politicians at any level be it federal, provincial or in this case municipal.

By the way, I got 13 pages from the Canadian Heritage, which I gave to the Twp. Of Guelph/Eramosa. I had since obtained two pages and a phone call from the same source and a copy of an email from the past chairman of the Dominion Command Ritual and Awards Committee, Royal Canadian Legion.

I believe more strongly that even only the Canadian flag should fly at our Cenotaph. That is the best way to support our Troops.
