Mandatory odd/even water restrictions are lifted

With the cooler fall weather expected and the success of this summer's mandatory water restriction period, Halton Region has now ended the mandatory odd/even water use restriction. However, the Region is still asking all residents and businesses to continue to voluntarily restrict their water use

Odd numbered homes should water on odd numbered calendar days and even numbered homes on even numbered calendar days. Outdoor watering includes watering lawns, flowers, vegetable gardens, trees and shrubs.

To further preserve Halton's water supply, the Region is also asking residents to refrain from washing their driveway or the sidewalk. Further



details of specific water use restrictions and exemptions can be found on the Region's website at www. halton.ca. Since lawns only need

one inch of water once a week to stay healthy, it is not necessary to water on every odd or even day. By using a rain gauge, residents can accurately monitor the amount of water their lawn receives naturally each week.

The Region is thanking those residents and businesses that complied with the water use restrictions for helping to preserve essential water supplies.

Halton Region's Planning and Public Works staff say they are monitoring the Region's water reservoir levels closely. If the hot, dry weather returns, it may be-
