

Litterbug give away sends message

On Wednesday, September 26 Mayor Bonnette and Halton Hills Councillors will be giving away free litterbags at Tim Horton's drive-thru windows in Acton and Georgetown during the morning rush hour. This is the third time that the Litter Free Halton Hills Task Force has organized a litter-

bag giveaway as a means of reducing litter on streets and rural roads.

"This giveaway was very well received the past two years once people realized we weren't trying to sell them something." said Task Force Chair Councillor Jane Fogal.

"The idea of giving the

litterbag to people right at the drive-thru gets the bag directly into the car. It makes the point that we don't want to see stuff flying out the window 10 minutes after they leave the drive-thru." said Helen MacCormack, a Chamber of Commerce volunteer on the Task Force.

Councillors and volunteers

are out to show the public that littering is an important issue but we need everyone's help to fix it." said Mayor Bonnette.

The Litter Free Halton Hills Task Force is made up of community volunteers, members of the Chamber of Commerce, council members and town staff.

Plastic Does Not Compost!

Don't put your yard waste in plastic bags, they are not accepted in the yard waste program. Plastic pots, flower markers or plant tags do not go in your yard waste. Plastic does not decompose and reduces the quality of the final compost product.

Instead, use only paper yard waste bags, or labelled, reusable, rigid containers with no lids. Yard waste labels for reusable containers are available at no charge from Halton Region.

Acceptable yard waste materials include yard and garden trimmings; pumpkins; fallen fruit from trees and tree trimmings.

Please "grasscycle" by leaving grass clippings on your lawn. Grass clippings are mostly water and will quickly decompose, releasing valuable nutrients back into the soil. Grasscycling does not cause thatch!

Brush must be tied in bundles no larger than 1.2 m (4 ft) by 0.6 m (2 ft) wide, with branches a maximum of 7.5 cm (3 inches in diameter).

Yard waste materials will be collected **every other week** on the same day as your Blue Box until December 7.
