practicing here.

The EWFHT was originally a project of EWAG. Recently, the EWFHT was incorporated as a separate non-profit corporation which will continue to work in close partnership with EWAG and other relevant community agencies. The Town of Erin and the Township of Guelph/Eramosa have already committed capital funds to assist in securing appropriate facilities to house this initiative.

An executive director has been hired and the EWFHT is well on its way to opening its doors early in 2008. Those who would like to be involved in this project, there are four specific ways to do so:

1.Become a rostered patient at the Erin Family Health Clinic. Dr. Bull, Dr. Neilsen and Dr. Lennox are currently accepting new patients, and funding for the EWFHT is tied directly to the number of patients enrolled in their practice. The team hopes the medical practice in Rockwood, currently staffed by Dr. Hosdil, will soon be able to accept new patients as well, as recruitment of a new physician is actively underway.

2. Volunteer as an EWFHT director. A commitment of six to eight hours per month
