Buying a wood stove? -take proper precautions

There's nothing quite like the warmth and relaxation from a fire in a wood stove. The smell of burning wood in the crisp fall air and its crackle as it burns is an enjoyable experience.

More efficient than open face fire places, wood stoves are an alternative to oil or gas heating but proper precautions must be observed so accidents don't happen, says Halton Hills Chief of Fire Prevention & Public Education Harry Olivieri, who offers these tips:

1. Check municipal bylaws for necessary building permits, inspections and fees.

2. Shop around and make inquiries from competent, qualified retailers. Ask if they are WETT Certified (Wood Energy Technical Training).

3. Check with your insurance agent for any possible requirements they may have regarding fire insurance coverage.

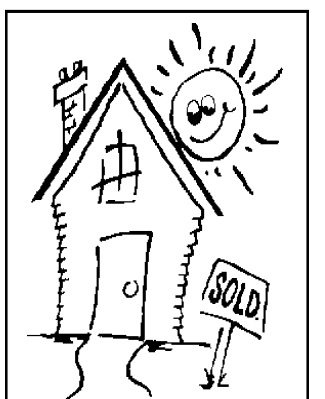
4. Don't be over-sold. Buy the appliance most suited for the area it is to heat. Bigger is not always better in this case.

5. Ensure all manufacturers instructions are followed. This appliance is designed and built to certain criteria.

Do not deviate from these instructions.

6. If the decision to buy is confirmed, choose a reputable installer and one who is WETT Certified. Your insurance company may be able to provide references for you to consider.

Last, but not above all... Ensure your home is equipped with working smoke alarms on each level!

INTERESTED

- all positions are for a term to expire December 2010
- must be 18 years of age and resident of the Town of Halton Hills
- must not be a Town of Halton Hills employee
- unless otherwise specified, all positions are volunteer
- meetings generally occur in the evenings

THE COMMITTEES

Committee of Adjustment

- meets once or twice per month
- remuneration of \$80 for member per meeting
- to act as a decision-making body which considers applications for minor variances to the Town's Zoning By-laws and the applications to sever parcels of land

Heritage Halton Hills

- regular monthly meetings
- to act as an advisory body respecting the designation of buildings of historical and architectural interest under the Ontario Heritage Act.

Litter Free Task Force Committee

- to act as an advisory committee in respect to the implementation of a comprehensive town-wide strategy for reducing litter and vandalism

Town Environmental Advisory Committee

- to be composed of both individuals who have a professional interest in the field of environmental management and of individuals who have a personal interest in environmental protection
- regular monthly meetings and sub-committee meetings as needed
- to act as an advisory body seeking ways to protect, restore and enhance the Town's natural environment

Trails Advisory Committee

- to act as an advisory committee to provide advice and input to the Town of Halton Hills on matters relating to the design, construction and funding of a trails system
- identify issues that impact trails development in Halton Hills
- bring forward ideas for developing and maintaining trail systems
- act as a sounding board in response to issues and initiatives
- determine appropriate action to deal with issues and initiatives

Halton Hills Accessibility Advisory Committee

- regular monthly meetings
- act as an advisory committee to provide advice and input to the Town of Halton Hills to fulfill obligations under the Accessibilities for Ontarians with Disabilities Act
