High School bands tour schools

Public school gymnasiums across Acton and Georgetown erupted with cheers and applause as Acton High School's Jazz and Concert bands toured local feeder schools on Thursday Dec. 6.

In a full day of touring, the bands visited Robert Little Public School, Limehouse Public School, and Stewarttown Middle School. The band and its teacher supervisors loaded the bus, leaving for Robert Little around 8:30 a.m.

ADHS music teacher and band conductor Peter Wilcox says the two bands have been working toward this tour since the beginning of the school year. "They've all worked really hard," he says.

After the children of Limehouse Public School had been

ushered into their seats on the floor of the school's gym, Wilcox quieted the band and turned to speak to his pint sized spectators. He told them about passing a man in red in the school bus on the way there, he then turned back to the band and led them through Santa Claus is Coming To Town, much to the approval of the children.

Both the Jazz and the Concert bands played several songs during the performance. Their set of around 45 minutes contained a variety of music with a big sound that comes from a small town band. Their catalogue of songs included those from the pen of Bach, as well as numerous Christmas carols and even a few songs from the swinging sixties.

"When I was your age I used to dance to this next one," Wilcox said to the

attentive crowd. The band then started into a mixture of sixties rock songs including Louie Louie, Na Na, Hey Hey, and Born To Be Wild.

After playing a few more songs, the band started into a montage of Christmas carols. Wilcox asked the kids to sing along when they knew the words. The crowd of enthusiastic young listeners clapped their hands, danced in their seats and sang along to the likes of Frosty the Snowman and Rudolf The Red Nosed Reindeer.

The gym echoed with the enthusiasm of young people in the Christmas spirit.

This was Wilcox's 18th year doing the day-long band tour. "It should be my 19th year, but there was a year we didn't do it because of the cancellation of extra curricular activities," he says. "But


the bands of Acton High have been doing this forever."

The band's next big performance will be at Acton High School on Thursday, December 13. This show is the high school's annual Christmas Concert. The event starts at 7:00 p.m. and admission is free.

"It's our gift to the community," Wilcox said.






