Green light unique to Town, Milton

Milton Fire Department's "Green Light Awareness Week" was held this year the week of January 21, to increase public awareness that part-time/volunteer firefighters display a flashing green light when responding to an emergency and to remind drivers to yield right of way to the firefighters.

Green lights are installed on the front of fire trucks to ensure that all fire-related vehicles are equipped with a green light and to add consistency to the program. Special signs are also located throughout the community to help educate the public about the program.

The use of green lights by part-time firefighters is permitted through a provision in the Province's Highway Traffic Act, but the use of the lights on fire trucks and street signs is unique to the towns of Milton and Halton Hills.

The Milton Fire Department is comprised of both full-time and part-time firefighters. When an emergency occurs, part-time firefighters are paged. They respond immediately by activating the flashing green lights on their personal vehicles and driving to their designated fire station as quickly and safely as possible.
