ready aware, our team was stripped of a win in game five of the quarter-final series against the Lincoln Blades resulting in the Blades advancing to the semi-final series not having won 3 out of 5 games in the quarter-final round. There was an error on the game sheet for one of the previous games. Unfortunately, during that game, one of our players received a 2 minute minor penalty coded as an AGG and a GM50 which was taken as only a one game suspension because the AGG was not listed as a "major" penalty as per the OMHA Bulletin

about penalty coding. Apparently, the 2 min. AGG is an "unwritten" penalty that carries a one game suspension, unbeknownst to our coaching staff and manager!! Had this information been shared with our manager or coaching staff by the Lincoln coaching staff prior to the start of the game in question, there would not have been any issue to protest. We would have suspended the player without question. Instead, with the information in hand, Lincoln launched a protest after the game.

I find it very difficult to understand how a governing body for a youth sport is able to, in good conscience, award an unearned win to a team with such questionable ethics! What message are we sending to our children? It is better to win by any means possible than to train, better our skills and beat our opponent on the ice. I understand that there are four teams to which this has occurred

this year! That is remarkable! If other teams who are less skilled are able to win and advance merely by protesting a clerical error - I think that we need either new management or new rules.

I am beginning to realize that the coveted OMHA trophy may not be as great a win as I had previously thought. Who knows if the 'best' team actually wins the trophy or whether it is simply the best coaching/managing staff with advanced political knowledge.

I, and many others, still believe that a win should take place out on the ice and not in the back room going over a game sheet.

I also understand the Mississauga hockey association has an absolute rule that if one team has information about a game/game sheet that they do not share with the other team and a protest is launched based on this information, the Association won't even hear the protest based on the highly unethical nature of the protest. Does the OMHA not have the same rule? This practice is highly unethical and should, at least, be addressed with both teams present. At the very least, the game in question should be replayed and the 'BEST' team - be it Lincoln or Acton - advance to the semi-final series against Dorchester.






