Drug lab owner's home seized

Tuyen Ngo, formerly of Duffield Road, in Brampton, plead guilty to charges of unlawfully producing a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance in federal court on Feb. 10.

The charges were laid in connection with a June 1, 2006 investigation conducted by Halton Regional Police at a property owned by Ngo, located at 42 Duncan Drive, Georgetown. The residence contained a sophisticated cannabis marijuana laboratory.

On Feb. 6, 2007, the Provincial Asset Forfeiture Unit placed a restraint on the residence to hold the property for a future forfeiture hearing. During Ngo's Feb. 19, 2008 court appearance, the Court ordered forfeiture of the residence to the Receiver General of Canada.

"This is the first grow operation forfeiture in Halton Region." Said Inspector Chris Perkins, head of the HRPS Criminal Investigations Division. "Asset forfeiture is a valuable tool that police can use to help ensure public safety and sends a strong message to criminals that we will not tolerate grow operations in our communities."

Windy Days **Help Keep Halton Beautiful**

You can help reduce litter by preventing your Blue Box materials and garbage from blowing around your neighbourhood on windy days.

Please put your Blue Boxes and garbage at the curb securely:

- On windy days, put your waste at the curb by 7 a.m. the morning of your collection day, not the night before.
- Put your address on your Blue Box, garbage can and garbage lid.
- Stack your Blue Boxes and place heavier items such as phone books and magazines on top of loose papers. Bundle and tie papers. Fill boxboard boxes with other boxboard material.
- Flatten and tie large cardboard boxes and place securely underneath or between your Blue Boxes.
- Put garbage bags at the curb instead of garbage cans; garbage cans are more likely to blow around.
- Don't overfill Blue Boxes.
- If you need additional Blue Boxes, new residents can get two free of charge, current residents can get one free of charge from the following locations:
