Significant investments to maintain and replace existing infrastructure, and to deliver new infrastructure to support economic development are also in-

Key challenges for the 2009 budget are an expected increased demand for social services, public health and the infrastructure program.

In response to the current economic uncertainty, Council is considering a six month delay to fill any of the new positions included in the proposed budget. The six month delay will allow Council to consider the impact of the changing economy, including impacts associated with the Provincial budget, which is expected to be delivered in March, 2009.
