

Arnott blames Liberals for York U. impasse

After voting on Sunday afternoon to end the strike at York University, Wellington-Halton Hills MPP Ted Arnott spoke in the Ontario Legislature Monday about the ongoing labour disruption.

"Yesterday, Sunday afternoon, I was in this House to vote for Bill 145 - An Act to resolve labour disputes between York University and Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 3903.

"I was in this House to support immediate passage of this legislation, to stand with the many hundreds of students from Wellington-Halton Hills enrolled at York University. Their

education has been interrupted—their futures put on hold because of a strike that has gone on for 80 days.

"It was disappointing the New Democrats refused to give their consent for swift passage of Bill 145—disappointing, but not entirely surprising, because they want to be seen as supporting their union constituency, and because they are in the midst of a leadership contest.

"Let's remember who's ultimately accountable for this mess. It is this do-nothing government, which waited far too long to step in to allow the students back in to their labs and lecture halls.

"They should have listened to the MPP for Thornhill, the MPP for Simcoe-Grey and the rest of the PC caucus, all of us, who called before

Christmas for legislation to end this strike. "Students want to be

learning. It's a shame that this government still hasn't learned."
