## Purity Life worker injured in 18' fall

The Ministry of Labour continues to investigate how a worker at Purity Life fell 18 feet from a lifting device, severely injuring himself, in an industrial accident at the health food distributor's Commerce Court plant at 12:25 a.m. on February 4. Purity Life Health Products is a division of SunOpta Inc.

Although the company and investigators have not identified the man, a source told The New Tanner that the injured worker is John Thompson. He is listed in stable condition in a Hamilton hospital, suffering from multiple injuries, including head trauma.

Bruce Skeaff, a spokesman for the Ministry of Labour, said their inspector has asked Purity for nine things, most of them paperwork related, including the certificate for the lifting device, copies of the lifting device's maintenance manual, personnel information, minutes of safety meetings and health and safety accident procedures. SunOpta information officer Susan Wiek-

enkamp declined to give any details about the injured worker or the accident except to say that the company is "committed to employee health and safety and is fully co-operating" with the Ministry of Labour investigation and had been in contact with the man's family.

A source said the worker was wearing a safety rig, but it was not tethered to anything when he fell as he reached for something on a high level rack.
