Halton among safest places to live in Canada

Halton Region is the safest place to live in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) and Acton and Georgetown are the safest places to live in Halton, a trend that began in 2004.

Halton is also the safest regional municipality in Canada according to Maclean's magazine's 2009 last week. Halton was also the safest GTA community last year. Halton police statistics show that Halton Hills has the lowest crime rate of the Region's four municipalities. The Maclean's figures and the Halton police statistics are based on 2007 data.

Chief Gary Crowell said, "As police, we are privileged to work in a region where local residents, municipalities and business owners want to work collaboratively with us. and they are all keen to do their part to prevent and deter crime." Crowell said the Maclean's rank-

crime rankings released results – in a press release officers, volunteers, local politicians and community partners are committed to keeping Halton as safe tomorrow as it is today.


Maclean's ranking was based on aggregate results of the 2007 per capital crime rates in six areas including personal and property crimes, murder, sexual assault, aggravated assault, robbery, breaking and entering and auto theft. Saskatoon had the highest crime rate in Canada.

Halton police's director of corporate communications, Janice Coffin said Halton ranks fifth on the most desirable places to live and is the only regional municipality in the top five.

The safest community to live in is Caledon – onesixth the size of Halton.

"This (ranking) is not something police take sole credit for. It's really a testament of how in Halton the community is really engaged and keen to work with police," Coffin said, adding there are a number of factors beyond police control that affect the crime rate including population, socio-economic standings and demographics.

Figures released by Keith Moore, a Halton police planner, indicate that Halton Hills had the lowest crime rate per 100,000 people in Halton at 2,824. Oakville's crime rate


Income Tax Help
