Police caution on false inspectors

Halton Regional Police are warning the public to be wary of persons fraudulently misrepresenting themselves as food inspectors to local merchants after an incident Tuesday, March 4, at the "Hasty Market" retail store on Sixth Line, in Oakville.

A woman at the store at 11:45am indicated to the store manager that she was a "Food & Water Safety Technician." She presented a business card indicating she was from the "Canadian Food Safety Resource Centre" from Ottawa.

The woman tried to coerce the store manager to purchase a \$39.95 testing kit used to detect bacteria, namely Lysteria, in food, police said. The store manager was suspicious and declined. She then tried to coerce the manager into buying by stating he could be liable to health code violations and financial penalties. When this failed the woman left.

The suspect is described as being a black female, approximately 5'0", with a medium build. She had dark shoulder length hair and was wearing a beige coat with a red scarf.

Police said, other similar incidents had occurred at "Hasty Market" locations in Ontario.
